Dunking Booth Equipment Rental
Liability Release & Express Assumption of Risk

I understand and acknowledge that the activity to be engaged in through my rental of Dunking Booth equipment from the Denton FFA Alumni Association brings with it known and unanticipated risks to my guests, my invitees and myself. Those risks include but are not limited to falling, slipping, crashing, and colliding and could result in injury, emotional distress, death, and /or property damage to myself or my guests and invitees.

I voluntarily release, indemnify, and hold harmless and discharge the Denton FFA Alumni Association and its agents from any and all claims, demands, actions or rights of action, whether personal to me or a third party, which are related to, arise out of, or are in any way connected to my rental of the Dunking Booth from the Denton FFA Alumni Association including those allegedly to negligent acts of omissions. I agree to reimburse any reasonable attorney's fees and costs, which may be incurred by the Denton FFA Alumni Association in the defense of such liability claim, demand, action or right of action.

I acknowledge that I have adequate homeowner's insurance, tenant insurance, or other liability insurance to cover any bodily injury or property damage which might occur to myself, my guests, or invitees from the use of the rental of the Dunking Booth from the Denton FFA Alumni Association or else I agree to bear the costs of such injury or damage myself.

I agree to provide supervision of both the equipment and its use at all time said equipment is in my possession.

Detailed below is a set of directions for use and safety rules which I agree to follow and utilize at all times during the operation and use of the rental of the Dunking Booth from the Denton FFA Alumni Association.

- (1) No more than one (1) Target Person will be allowed be inside the dunking booth at a time during booth operations.
- (2) One (1) Booth Attendant must be present to supervise and assist with ball retrieval and target reset during booth operations.
- (3) FFA Alumni personnel will be responsible for the setup and break down of all dunking booth equipment; the renter should not attempt these activities to avoid damage & injury.
- (4) The Rental User is responsible for filling and draining the dunk tank during its rental use.
- (5) The Rental User will assume financial responsibility for any loss or damage to the Dunking Booth equipment during the rental use.

Dunking Booth Safety

- ✍ Only one person should be inside the dunking booth during operation.
- ✍ Always enter the dunking booth from the rear. Use the trailer axle as a step when entering the booth tank. Be very careful of slippery footing caused by wet surfaces.
- ✍ Safe dunk tank entry requires slowly slipping into the tank of water before trying to climb onto the target seat.
- ✍ Outside assistance is necessary to maneuver the target arm as the target volunteer raises the seat to the ready position.
- ✍ Ladder steps inside the tank (front right) should be used to climb from inside the tank to the target seat when in the ready position.
- ✍ Once on the target seat, sit as you would on a bench seat facing forward.
- ✍ Do not hold onto the seat when being dunked.
- ✍ Do not wrap your legs underneath the seat when being dunked.
- ✍ Do not grab for the cage or frame when being dunked.
- ✍ Just relax and let yourself drop into the water while being dunked.
- ✍ Be extremely careful when exiting the dunk tank. Tank frame and axle can be very slippery when wet.
- ✍ Proper exiting of the dunk tank consists of climbing out the rear of the tank. Swinging one leg up onto the rear wall. Then slide your body up onto the rear wall and lower your leg down slowly onto the trailer axle.
